NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: I Kings 19:4-8

Queen Jezebel had vowed to kill Elijah, who went into the desert and prayed for death. Instead, he went to sleep and was awakened by an angel, who told him to eat the food God had given him. He ate and went back to sleep, but God's angel again woke him and told him to eat. Strengthened by the food, he got up and walked forty days and nights to the mountain of God.

Paul appeals to the Ephesians to get rid of bitterness, anger, and malice. Instead, they must be kind, compassionate, and forgiving just as God has been. We must be imitators of Christ, and love one another as he has loved us.

St. Maximilian Kolbe (August 14))

St. Maximilian Kolbe was born as Raymund Kolbe on January 8, 1894, in Poland, He was a Conventual Franciscan friar.

St. Maximilian Kolbe was very active in promoting the Immaculate Virgin Mary and is known as the Apostle of Consecration to Mary. Much of his life was strongly influenced by a vision he had of the Virgin Mary when he was 12. The Mother of God came to him holding two crowns, one white, the other red. The white one meant purity, and the red martyrdom.

In 1918, he was ordained a priest and continued his work of promoting Mary throughout Poland. Over the next several years, Kolbe took on publishing. He founded a monthly periodical titled, "Rycerz Niepokalanej" (Knight of the Immaculate). He also operated a religious publishing press and founded a new Conventual Franciscan monastery at Niepokalanow, which became a major religious publishing center. He also founded monasteries in both Japan and India.

In 1936, Kolbe's poor health forced him to return home to Poland, and once the WWII invasion by Germany began, he became one of the only brothers to remain in the monastery. He refused to sign a document that would recognize him as a German citizen with his German ancestry and continued to work in his monastery, providing shelter for refugees - including hiding 2,000 Jews from German persecution.

On February 17, 1941, the monastery was shut down; Kolbe was arrested by the German Gestapo and taken to the Pawiak prison. Three months later, he was transferred to Auschwitz.

Never abandoning his priesthood, Kolbe was the victim of severe violence and harassment. Toward the end of his second month in Auschwitz, men were chosen to face death by starvation to warn against escapes. Kolbe was not chosen but volunteered to take the place of a man with a family.

It is said during the last days of his life Kolbe led prayers to Our Lady with the prisoners and remained calm. He was the last of the group to remain alive, after two weeks of dehydration and starvation. The guards gave him a lethal injection of carbolic acid. The stories tell that he raised his left arm and calmly awaited death.

St. Maximilian Kolbe died on August 14, and his remains were cremated on August 15, the same day as the Feast of the Assumption.

Najsłodszy mój Panie, wejrzyj miłościwie na Twój lud, na Ciało Mistyczne Twojego Kościoła. Jakże mogłabym doznawać pociechy widząc siebie przy życiu, jeśliby lud Twój pogrążony był w śmierci, gdyby mroki grzechów z powodu moich nieprawości i nieprawości innych stworzeń ogarniały Twoją umiłowaną Oblubienicę.

Żarliwie przeto błagam o tę niepojętą łaskę, abyś okazał miłosierdzie ludowi Twemu w imię owej niezrównanej miłości, która Cię skłoniła do stworzenia człowieka na obraz i podobieństwo Twoje. I czemuż to, proszę, obdarzyłeś człowieka tak wielką godnością? Niewątpliwie, stało się tak jedynie dla niepojętej miłości, dzięki której dostrzegłeś Twe stworzenie w sobie samym i w nim się rozmiłowałeś. Wyznaję jednak otwarcie, iż przez grzech człowiek słusznie utracił godność, do jakiej został wyniesiony.

Ty zaś wiedziony tą samą miłością i pragnąc w swojej dobroci pojednać ludzi ze sobą, dałeś nam Słowo, Twojego Jednorodzonego Syna, który stał się prawdziwym Pośrednikiem między nami a Tobą. On stał się naszą sprawiedliwością. W sobie samym zniweczył wszystkie nasze nieprawości i grzechy mocą posłuszeństwa, którego Ty, Ojcze niebieski, odeń zażądałeś polecając Mu przyjąć naszą ludzką naturę.

O niezrównana głębio miłości! Jakież serce może pozostać tak twarde, by się nie

poruszyć i nie zadrżeć widząc, że tak wielka wzniosłość zstąpiła ku tak przepastnej niskości. Bo taką właśnie jest nasza ludzka natura.

Jesteśmy Twoim obrazem, a Ty obrazem naszym dzięki jedności, jaką ustanowiłeś między sobą a człowiekiem. Wiekuiste Bóstwo skryłeś pod nędzną zasłoną skażonej natury ludzkiej. Dlaczego? Jedynie dla Twej niewypowiedzianej miłości. Przez ową niepojętą miłość pokornie i ze wszystkich sił mej duszy błagam Twój Majestat, abyś biednym stworzeniom okazał swoje łaskawe miłosierdzie.

From Fr. Marcin's Desk

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

We continue the reading of Chapter Six of the Gospel according to John, in which Jesus, after performing the great miracle of the multiplication of the loaves, explains to the people the meaning of that "sign." Jesus begins from the experience of hunger and the sign of bread, to reveal Himself and to offer an invitation to believe in Him.

The people seek Him, the people listen to Him, because they are still enthusiastic about the miracle; they want to make Him king! However, when Jesus affirms that He is the true bread given by God, many are shocked. They do not understand and begin murmuring among themselves saying, "Do we not know his father and mother? How does he now say, 'I have come down from heaven'?" Then Jesus says, "No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him," and he adds, "he who believes has eternal life."

This word of the Lord astonishes us and makes us think. It introduces the dynamic of faith, which is a relationship - the relationship between God and me to believe in Him, it is not enough to meet Jesus, to read the Bible, to witness a miracle, such as that of the multiplication of the loaves. So many people were in close contact with Jesus, and they still did not believe. This happened because their hearts were closed to the action of God's Spirit. If your heart is always closed, faith doesn't enter! Instead, God the Father draws us to Jesus; it is we who open or close our hearts. Faith, which is like a seed deep in the heart, blossoms when we let the Father draw us to Jesus, and we "go to Him" with an open heart.

With this attitude of faith, we can also understand the meaning of the "Bread of Life" that Jesus gives us, and which He describes in this way, "I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if any one eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh." In Jesus, in his "flesh" that is, in his concrete humanity is all the love of God, which is the Holy Spirit. Those who let themselves be drawn by this love go to Jesus and go with faith and receive from Him life **–eternal life**.
