TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Sirach 27:30—28:9

Sirach advises all to forgive the faults of their neighbor. Only by forgiving the sins of others, can a person expect to be forgiven his sins.

Second Reading: Romans 14:7-9

Paul stresses that no one is his own master; we are responsible to the Lord, and we belong to him in both life and death.

Gospel: Matthew 18:21-35

This narrative points out the difference between mercy and justice. When Peter asks how often he should forgive someone who wrongs him, Jesus answers, "...not seven times: I say seventy times seven times." Jesus then narrates the story of the king who was merciful to his official by forgiving him all his debts, but this same official showed no mercy to his own servant.

The Saint of the Week

St. Andrew Kim Taegon (September 20)

He was born on 21 August 1821, in Chungchong Province, Korea. His parents, being converts to Catholicism, were subject to persecution, to avoid which they moved to Kyonggi Province. At 15 years old, Kim Tae-gon was chosen by a visiting priest to be a seminarian, and was sent with two other seminarians to Macao. He arrived in 1837 and began his studies with the missionaries of the Far Eastern Procure of the Parish Foreign Mission Society. In 1842 Kim Tae-gon left Macao as an interpreter for a French admiral aboard a warship. When the admiral returned to France, Kim Tae-gon tried to return to his homeland through the strictly guarded northern frontier, but he failed. He was ordained a deacon in China in 1844 and managed to return to Korea the next year, arriving in Seoul early in 1845. He then led the French missionaries by sea to Shanghai, where Bishop Ferreol ordained him the first Korean priest in the Church's 60-year history in Korea. He returned to Korea with Bishop Ferreol, reaching Chungchong Province in October of the same year. In his home town and vicinity, he catechized the faithful, until Bishop Ferreol summoned him to Seoul. At the Bishop's command, he tried to introduce French missionaries from China into Korea, enlisting the aid of Chinese fishermen. For this, Father Kim Tae-gon was arrested and sent to the central prison in Seoul, where he was charged as the ringleader of a heretical sect and traitor to his country. He was sentenced to death and was beheaded on 16 September 1846. He was canonized by Pope John-Paul II on 6 May 1984.

Polskie Duszpasterstwo w Parafii św. Bernarda i św. Stanisława Kostki



24 Niedziela Zwykla

W przypowieści, którą czytamy w dzisiejszej Ewangelii, mówiącej o miłosiernym królu, spotykamy dwukrotnie tę prośbę: "Okaż mi swą cierpliwość, a oddam tobie". Za pierwszym razem wypowiada ją sługa, który winien jest swojemu panu dziesięć tysięcy talentów – ogromną sumę, dziś byłoby to wiele milionów dolarow. Drugi raz wypowiada ją inny sługa tego samego pana. Również on jest zadłużony, nie u swojego pana, lecz u tamtego sługi, który ma ów olbrzymi dług. A jego dług jest bardzo znikomy, może taki jak tygodniowa zapłata.

Sednem przypowieści jest wyrozumiałość, okazana przez pana słudze mającemu największy dług. Ewangelista podkreśla, że "pan ulitował się – nie należy nigdy zapominać tego słowa, które jest właściwe Jezusowi: 'ulitował się', Jezus zawsze się litował – [ulitował się] nad owym sługą, uwolnił go i dług mu darował". Olbrzymi dług, a zatem ogromne umorzenie! Lecz ów sługa zaraz po tym okazuje się bezlitosny wobec swojego kolegi, który winien mu jest niewielką sumę. Nie słucha go, pomstuje na niego i wtrąca go do więzienia, dopóki nie odda długu, tego niewielkiego długu. Pan dowiaduje się o tym i, oburzony, przywołuje niegodziwego sługę i go skazuje. "Ja ci darowałem tak wiele, a ty nie potrafisz darować mało?"

W przypowieści widzimy dwie różne postawy: postawe Boga - reprezentowanego przez króla – który przebacza bardzo wiele, bo Bóg zawsze przebacza, i postawę człowieka. W postawie Boga sprawiedliwość jest przeniknięta miłosierdziem, natomiast postawa ludzka ogranicza sie do sprawiedliwości. Jezus nas zachęca do odważnego otwarcia się na moc przebaczenia, bo w życiu nie wszystko rozwiązuje się przez sprawiedliwość, wiemy o tym. Potrzeba owej miłosiernej miłości, która jest także u podstawy odpowiedzi Pana na pytanie Piotra, które poprzedza te przypowieść. Pytanie Piotra brzmi: "Panie, ile razy mam przebaczyć, jeśli mój brat zawini względem mnie?". A Jezus mu odpowiada: "Nie mówię ci, że aż siedem razy, lecz aż siedemdziesiąt siedem razy". W symbolicznym języku Biblii oznacza to, że mamy przebaczać zawsze!

Jak wiele cierpienia, jak wielu podziałów, jak wielu wojen można by uniknąć, gdyby stylem naszego życia były przebaczenie i miłosierdzie! Także w rodzinie, jakże wiele jest rodzin podzielonych, które nie potrafią sobie przebaczyć, jak wielu braci i sióstr ma w sobie tę urazę. Konieczne jest zastosowanie miłości miłosiernej we wszystkich relacjach ludzkich.

Mądrości Syracha mówi: "Pamiętaj o rzeczach ostatecznych i przestań nienawidzić". Dobre zdanie! Pomyśl o końcu! Pomyśl o tym, że będziesz w trumnie... I zabierzesz tam ze sobą nienawiść? Pomyśl o końcu, przestań nienawidzić. Puść w niepamięć urazę.

Nie jest łatwo przebaczać, bowiem w chwilach spokojnych człowiek mówi: "Tak, ten źle postąpił wobec mnie wielokrotnie, ale ja też wiele razy źle postąpiłem. Lepiej przebaczyć, żeby uzyskać przebaczenie". Ale potem uraza powraca, jak natrętna mucha latem, która wraca, wciąż wraca i wraca... Przebaczenie nie jest sprawą tylko jednej chwili, to rzecz ciągła na przekór tej urazie, tej nienawiści, które powracają. Pomyślmy o końcu, przestańmy nienawidzić.

Dzisiejsza przypowieść pomaga nam w pełni zrozumieć znaczenie tego zdania, które wypowiadamy w modlitwie Ojcze nasz: "Przebacz nam nasze winy, tak jak i my przebaczamy tym, którzy przeciw nam zawinili". Te słowa zawierają decydującą prawdę. Nie możemy domagać się dla siebie przebaczenia Bożego, jeżeli my sami nie przebaczamy naszemu bliźniemu. Jest pewien warunek – pomyśl o końcu, o przebaczeniu Bożym, i przestań nienawidzić - odpędź urazę, tę uprzykrzoną muchę, która wciąż wraca. Jeżeli nie zdobędziemy się na wysiłek, żeby przebaczyć i kochać, to również my nie uzyskamy przebaczenia i nie będziemy kochani.


